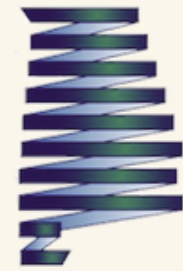

What Are WE Going to Do?... by Ronnie Brewer, Coordinator



As the year ends for Alabama CBF, I am remembering several phone calls on the morning of April 28th, the day after the worst tornado disaster any of us have ever seen or even could have imagined in our state. There was a common theme in those phone calls that now makes me grateful, even in

such a tragedy. Most everyone that called said, "What are **we** going to do?" I had a few calls from bordering states, mostly from wonderful friends and pastors saying, "What are **ya'll** going to do? Can **we** help with that?"

Though it is very tempting to write more fully about what all has been done in Alabama by the work cooperatively of our Alabama CBF churches, I really just want to highlight one word for the New Year from those calls that day. **We**, as in: what are "**we**" going to do? **We**.

It thrilled me to hear from so many across our state who felt in that time of crisis that **we** are indeed a "**we**". There was the belief that there was work that could best be done together, even in the face of such unimaginable and overwhelming disaster. One old friend said "you are getting paid to coordinate us, so think of something **we** can do together to help with this, and let us know." I think I liked that call the best. Together. What are **we** going to do?

We did do something didn't **we**? **We** couldn't do everything. **We** couldn't even be real sure how all of our plans would play out or if they would even be successful, but **we** divided up the state into small measurable areas of poverty, disaster, and despair. Then, **we** clustered our churches together and **we** began to work: together. Terri, Natalie and I cheered and coached and prayed. Leaders and heroes and strategies emerged out of our churches and their clusters. And all of us

helped our state more as a "**we**" than **we** could have alone.

This past year there seemed to be a good deal done together even beyond our work with tornado relief. We experienced support, exchange of ideas, communication of needs and resources, aid and prayer for churches in need, help for churches searching for ministers, missions education, poverty relief, and fellowship and friendship. I am sure I not remembering all of the things that we have done together this year. I do know that Alabama CBF has made some strides in 2011 in knowing one another, working with one another, and in thinking about our family of churches as better together than alone. The tornados were horrible. I think God did a good thing in them however when our churches and people asked, "What are **we** going to do?" I think he will continue to do wonderful things in our healthy family of churches in 2012. Especially if **we** continue to ask: what are **we** going to do?

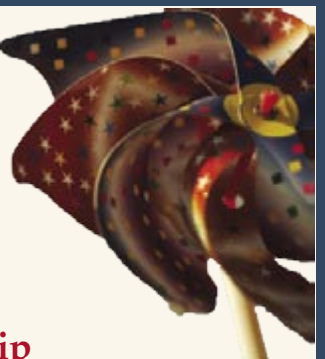

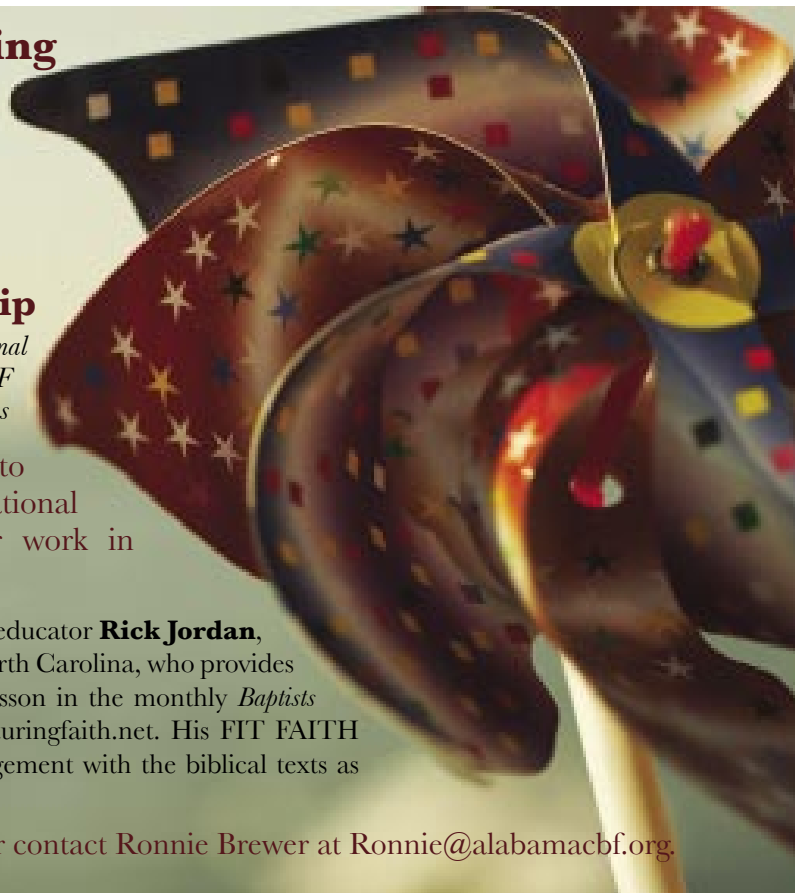
Improvisational Leadership

Soul Food: Just Folk Coffeehouse by Terri Byrd for *Baptists Today*

An excerpt from the November edition of *Baptists Today*

In Elba, Alabama, the place to be at lunchtime is the **Just Folk Coffeehouse** right off the town square. Just steps away from the courthouse across the street, it's where the locals who are working in town walk to for the daily special, conversation, and a piece of pie. It also happens to be the church office for Covenant Community Church and where the pastor, Mart Gray, spends time talking with people. ...

"Some people may ask why a church runs a coffee house," said Mart. "But the people of Covenant really believe that this is our signature ministry. It's a way to connect to the people of our community."

Since opening Just Folk, the church has grown. "We've had some people join Covenant, but we also have people who have simply become part of a fellowship of people who come to meet and talk at the coffee house," said Mart. "In some ways, we've become the church on the square. There are days when you may just need someone to talk to ... and a piece of pie."
